C. McGuire made the motion to approve the Consent Agenda. C. Svendsen seconded the motion; 5 Ayes, motion passed.

BUSINESS

AB 22-09 - Contract with COASTAL AG LLC for Pesticide Treatment

Ariel Smith, Community Development Director, presented the Agenda Bill. There is a need for additional pesticide treatment at the Dohman reservoir and it must be treated by someone with the aquatic application endorsement. Coastal AG LLC is the only company listed in our area with such endorsement.

C. McGuire made the motion to authorize Mayor Phillips to enter into a contract with Coastal AG LLC for pesticide treatment on public lands. C. Svendsen seconded the motion; 5 Ayes, motion passed.

AB 22-10 Building Inspection Services Contract with the City of Ilwaco

David Glasson, City Administrator, presented the Agenda Bill. An updated agreement with Ilwaco to provide building inspection services needs to be signed.

C. Svendsen made the motion to authorize Mayor Phillips to sign the Agreement with the City of Ilwaco. C. McGuire seconded the motion; 5 Ayes, motion passed.

AB 22-11 - Resolution 2022-02- Ocean Wind Energy

David Glasson, City Administrator, presented the Agenda Bill. This item was discussed during the workshop preceding this meeting. This resolution opposes the development of wind energy off the coast of Washington state to protect and preserve the ocean's natural functionality and the crucial fishing industry.

Mayor Phillips tabled the agenda bill to discuss at a later date.

AB 22-12 - Resolution 2022-03- Surplus Equipment

David Glasson, City Administrator, presented the Agenda Bill. The only item listed on this surplus is the sludge truck. The city no longer has the need for the sludge truck as we process all the treated waste at the biosolids plant.

C. Coleman made the motion to authorize Mayor Phillips to sign Resolution 2022-03, surplusing the sludge truck. C. McGuire seconded the motion; 5 Ayes, motion passed.

AB 22-13 - Purchase of TV Truck

David Glasson, City Administrator, presented the Agenda Bill. The TV truck is used to TV both sewer and stormwater lines for any sort of blockage, break, belly, or abnormality in the lines. This helps the city repair those spots and prevents serious line breaks. In years past the city has hired a company annually for roughly \$35,000 per year. Purchasing this truck would eliminate the need to hire an outside company since the city would absorb those costs.

C. Svendsen made the motion to authorize city staff to purchase the TV truck. C. McGuire seconded the motion; 5 Ayes, motion passed.

EXHIBIT A

SCOPE OF WORK

CITY OF LONG BEACH LIFT STATION 1 SURVEY SERVICES

Gray & Osborne will provide survey services for wastewater Lift Station 1. Lift Station 1 is located on 15th Street SE between Pacific Avenue and Washington Avenue South. The lift station equipment is close to the property line.

The services to be provided include office engineering to research survey recordings in the vicinity of the lift station, field survey, and survey processing.

PROPOSED SCOPE OF WORK

The following elements are included in the scope of work.

Task 1 – Project Administration and Project Management

Provide overall project management to include resource allocation management and coordination with the City.

Task 2 – Office Engineering

Office engineering includes research of recorded surveys in the project vicinity to find the established right-of-way and property corners in the vicinity.

This task also includes creation of a signed survey document that will be used to record the survey, if requested by the City. In addition, this task includes preparation of an easement drawing for the City's use in procurement and recording of easements from adjacent property owners.

Task 3 – Field Survey

Field survey will consist of a two-person crew performing the on-site work. The crew will find monuments and collect topographical and surface feature points.

Task 4 - Process Survey

The survey point data collected in the field by the survey crew will be processed in CAD. Recording grade figures and descriptions will be prepared for the City's use.

The attached Exhibit B provides a detailed breakdown of the hours and rates for the proposal. The not-to-exceed cost for the proposed work is \$11,750 without further authorization from the City.

Note the costs do not include work to procure or negotiate easements.

This will help in keeping track of station fault issues raised with ChargePoint Support.
