David Glasson, City Administrator, called roll with C. Svendsen, C. Phelps, C. Reddy, and C. Coleman in attendance. Mayor Phillips and C. Murry were not in attendance.

Robbie Wright made a comment regarding the recent vacation rental code adoption.

C. Coleman made the motion to approve the Consent Agenda. C. Phelps seconded the motion; 4
Ayes, motion passed.

BUSINESS

AB 22-78 - Ordinance 1012 - 2022 Budget Amendment

David Glasson, City Administrator, presented the agenda bill. The Ordinance presented amends the 2022 budget to include additional funds for Fire Equipment and Streets Funds. The fire equipment fund had some additional expenditures related to the new fire truck. The streets fund exceeded original appropriation due to rising costs in labor and materials related to paving.

C. Coleman made the motion to approve Ordinance 1012, amending the 2022 budget. C. Reddy seconded the motion; 4 Ayes, motion passed.

AB 22-79 - TIB Grant Award OBB N Pioneer to 26th ST NW

David Glasson, City Administrator, presented the agenda bill. The Washington State Transportation Improvement Board has awarded the City of Long Beach \$204,915 for a segment of Ocean Beach Blvd. N. between Pioneer and 26th ST NW. By executing this agreement, the city is accepting the award, conditions of funding, and match requirements.

C. Reddy made the motion to authorize Mayor Phillips to sign the agreement. C. Phelps seconded the motion; 4 Ayes, motion passed.

AB 22-80 – Ordinance 1013 – Firefighters Compensation

David Glasson, City Administrator, presented the agenda bill. During the 2023 budget discussion, it was determined that there would be an increase for fire training and aid calls. This ordinance updates those rates - \$25 per training meeting, \$25 per EMT aid call, and \$15 for BLS aid calls.

C. Reddy made the motion to approve Ordinance 1013, updating the compensation for the Long Beach firefighters. C. Coleman seconded the motion; 4 Ayes, motion passed.

AB 22-81 – Agreement for Digital Marketing

David Glasson, City Administrator, presented the agenda bill. SagaCity has provided digital marketing for the city for a couple years and work closely with the Pacific County Tourism Bureau. This item has been included in the 2023 budget.

C. Coleman made the motion to authorize the Mayor to enter into the agreement with SagaCity for digital marketing in 2023. C. Reddy seconded the motion; 4 Ayes, motion passed.

SUMMARY STATEMENT:

RCW 35A.12.065

Pro tempore appointments.

Biennially at the first meeting of a new council, or periodically, the members thereof, by majority vote, may designate one of their number as mayor pro tempore or deputy mayor for such period as the council may specify, to serve in the absence or temporary disability of the mayor; or, in lieu thereof, the council may, as the need may arise, appoint any qualified person to serve as mayor pro tempore in the absence or temporary disability of the mayor. In the event of the extended excused absence or disability of a councilmember, the remaining members by majority vote may appoint a councilmember pro tempore to serve during the absence or disability.

SUMMARY STATEMENT: This is the annual contract the city has with the EDC for technical services. The EDC would like to have the Council approve this agreement and have the Mayor sign. This amount has been incorporated into the 2023 budget.

RECOMMENDED ACTION: Authorize the Mayor to sign the agreement.

2023 CONTRACT FOR TECHNICAL SERVICES

Between

City of Long Beach

and the

Pacific County Economic Development Council

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into on this first day of January 2023, the City of Long Beach, hereinafter referred to as the "City", and the Pacific County Economic Development Council, hereinafter referred to as the "EDC".

WHEREAS, the EDC is actively pursuing and facilitating the location and expansion of business and industry in Pacific County through the development of a marketing strategy aimed at attracting new business and industry, the implementation of business assistance programs, the promotion of tourism and retirement living, and the establishment of liaison with local, county and state governments as well as the private business sector to coordinate and promote economic growth and development while preserving the quality of life in Pacific County; and

WHEREAS, the City is undertaking certain activities necessary to promote economic growth and development; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to engage the EDC to render certain technical advice and assistance in connection with such undertakings by the City;

THEREFORE, the parties do mutually agree as follows:

- 1. Scope of Service. The EDC will: (a) receive from the City inquiries from businesses and industries indicating an interest in locating in the vicinity of the City and responding to such inquiries with information and materials including, but not limited to, wage rates, employment figures, personal income statistics, site availability and such other data as may be requested; (b) furnish current research data to assist the City in the area of economic growth and development. Such data shall include, but shall not be limited to, surveys of industrial growth within Pacific County, employment, population and general statistical information and other information of similar nature; (c) provide, free of additional charge, published materials prepared by the EDC to such persons as the City may direct plus other reports and studies as the EDC may prepare. Such materials may include, but are not limited to, wage rates, employment figures, personal income statistics and other special reports; and (d) serve as a general research reference service and assist in preparing replies to inquiries about facilities and resources required by new industries which may consider the City's services area for location or expansion.
- 2. <u>Time of Performance</u>. The services of the EDC are to commence on the first day of January, 2023 and continue to the thirty-first of December, 2023. This contract shall remain in effect and automatically renew for successive one year terms, unless terminated by either party in writing no less than thirty days prior to the expiration of the present term. Upon renewal, the same terms in this Contract shall apply with the exception of the service contract rates which will reflect the EDC board-approved annual service contract rates for the term.
- 3. <u>Compensation and Method of Payment.</u> The City shall reimburse the EDC for the services as follows:
- (a) The total contract price for the period specified in paragraph 2 shall be \$4,800.00.


- (b) Payment shall be due thirty days after receipt of Service Contract, signed by both parties. Payment shall be due in renewed years thirty days after the annual renewal date with no requirement for signature.
- (c) The EDC shall submit such properly executed vouchers, invoices, or expenditure reports to the City as are requested.
- 4. <u>Changes.</u> Either party may request changes in scope of services, performing or reporting standards or compensation amount or method. Proposed changes which are mutually agreed upon shall be incorporated by written amendments to this Agreement.
- 5. <u>Notices.</u> Written notices to each party shall be sent to the following addresses: Pacific County Economic Development Council, PO Box 1433, Long Beach, WA 98631 and the City of Long Beach, P.O. Box 310, Long Beach, WA 98631.
- 6. <u>Nondiscrimination.</u> The EDC certifies that it is an equal opportunity employer and that it does not discriminate in its hiring or employment practices or in the provision of any of its services on the basis of membership in any group protected by state or federal law.
- 7. <u>Liability.</u> The EDC shall hold the City and its officers, agents and employees acting in their official capacity or course of employment, harmless from all suits, claims or liabilities of any nature, for and on account of injuries or damages sustained by any person or property resulting in whole or part from activities or omissions of the EDC, its agents or employees pursuant to this agreement.
- 8. <u>Subcontracting.</u> The contract is personal to each of the parties thereto and neither party may assign or delegate any of its rights or obligations hereunder except as set forth in this contract.
- 9. <u>Integrated Document.</u> This contract embodies the contract, terms and conditions between the City and the Pacific County EDC. No verbal agreements or conversations any representatives of either party shall modify or affect the terms and obligations of this contract.




