Payment of Fees

Payment by check, cash, or money order is necessary. When your payment is due depends on what type of Vendor you are:

ALL-SEA SON VENDOR- pre-pay and attends all season (17 market days) or a minimum of 14 markets (82% of the season). If you do not attend the required minimum of 14 markets, you will be responsible to pay a **\$15 NO-SHOW Fee** for every market you didn't attend. You pay the lowest rates and receive priority in space selection on a first-paid-first-served basis. Our new annual fee for 2022 All-Season Vendors is \$150.00 (that's only \$8.82 per market). An all-season vendor saves \$190 compared to a week-to-week vendor. *All-Season Vendor payments are due no later than May 19, 2023.* A \$25 Late Fee will be charged if received after May 19th.

WEEK-TO-WEEK VENDOR- participates in the Market on a "just in time" basis, committing to participate on the Monday, Tuesday, or Wednesday immediately preceding the Market. Space assignment will be made on a first-come-first-served basis. The fee for Week-to-Week Vendors is \$20 a week. Week-to-Week Vendor payments are due in cash during Market set-up, sorry but no pay, no stay.

All spaces include an area 10 feet X 10 feet large enough for a canopy/booth (supplied by the Applicant), with staging area behind. You may reserve and pay for as many spaces as you like.
